### **Definition**

## **Editorial Policy**

This collection is intended to inform the community of conservators-restorers, conservation scientists, art historians and professionals from related disciplines the results of the latest research carried out in the field of conservation-restoration of cultural heritage.

Authors will be invited to present unpublished and relevant papers in the areas considered in the section *Scientific fields of interest*, assessing the relevance of the proposals and their contribution to the scientific community.

In any case, the director of the collection and the editorial committee consider that it is worth to cover all the relevant topics in this discipline when selecting the originals. The editorial committee will guarantee transparency in the evaluation process to authors, responding to the double-blind method and selecting specialized reviewers for a given

original, ensuring confidentiality and having no conflict of interest on the proposed evaluation

### • Submission of manuscripts

Authors interested in publishing in this collection, will consider first, that their work responds to the editorial line and the delimited topics. Secondly, they will send the original manuscript through the publication request form found on the publisher's website, selecting the name of the collection. The contents sent must be original and unpublished, and should not have been sent for evaluation to another publisher.

The deadline to submit manuscripts will close two months before publication, resulting in:

Submissions for March issue	Deadline: 15 <sup>th</sup> January
Submissions for October issue	Deadline. 15 <sup>th</sup> September

### • Selection procedure

After the submission of manuscripts the director of the collection and the editorial committee will make a first selection based on the opportunity and quality of the work, considering the criteria of the collection. This process can last for 30 days, after which the decision to send it for review or the justification for non-acceptance will be notified to the author.

The editorial committee reserves the right to decide if an original is published in the current issue or postponed for the next, depending on accepted applications.

### Peer review process

The evaluation of the selected works will be done through a double-bind peer review process, guaranteeing the anonymity of the reviewers and the authors.

Once that the original complies with the rules regarding style and content indicated in the guidelines for the authors has been verified, the director of the collection will send the work without identification to the members of the Advisory Board who will select two recognized specialists in the subject to carry out a review of the work, contributing its judgment on the merit of the work through a form available in the platform that includes comments regarding the valuation of the content (opportunity of the work, suitability of the title, etc.) methodology, graphical part, bibliography and final evaluation.

The director of the collection will communicate to the author the result of the review (rejected, accepted with modifications or accepted), as well as the observations and comments of the reviewers.

If the work is accepted with modifications, the authors must resend a new version, which will be submitted again for review by the same reviewers. If, during the review process, there is discrepancy between author and reviewer, it will be understood that these are produced in a constructive critical spirit, in order to improve publication.

The director will ensure that the reports of the reviewers are timely and constructive, they will be requested a new revision when it is considered that the one provided is not of sufficient quality, the same way will be warned when there are few days to meet the estimated review period.

Reviewers are required to sign a confidentiality document that will be provided for each work evaluated, which states that they have no conflict of interest with respect to accepted papers, and if they do, they will tell the director of the collection to select another reviewer.

#### Edition

This process begins when the author has received the editorial decision and this is accepted. At this time, the Editorial will review the texts linguistically and propose the appropriate considerations in this regard to the author. When the version of the Editorial is validated by the author and the director, the Editorial will start the edition and layout according to the style of the collection.

The mastered version will be validated by the director and the author, and only at this moment, the Editorial will be authorized to pass the final version to public communication in the platforms indicated in the following point.

#### Access

This collection provides immediate free access to its content under the principle that making research available to the public free of charge, supports a greater exchange of global knowledge.

Thus, access to the works will be immediate from the UPV Editorial Catalog and from the institutional repository Riunet.

### Copyright

The works published in this collection are subject to the following terms:

- The works are published in electronic format under a Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial-NoDerivative license 4.0. They may be copied, used, disseminated, transmitted and publicly displayed, provided the authorship, url, and Editorial are cited, and not used for commercial purposes.
- The publisher conserves the patrimonial rights of the published works, and favors and allows the reutilization of the same ones under the license described in previous point.

- The contents and images included in the work are the responsibility of the author, who guarantees (under a publishing contract to the Editorial), who has the necessary rights to use them.
- The authors are in agreement with the license of use used by the Editorial and with the policy of open access.
- o Authors are allowed to disseminate the published version of their works / chapters electronically (for example, in institutional repositories or on their own website), as it favors their circulation and dissemination, and thus a possible increase in their reviews or quotations within the academic community. This diffusion must be accompanied by the identification data of the work, in any case: title of the collection, editorial, volume and number, year and ISBN. In addition, the dissemination will be made under the same license that accompanies the published work.
